"From this year's entries it's clear that it now makes good business sense to improve animal welfare across food businesses. It makes a real point-of-difference in a very competitive market place."

This year, the RSPCA has also introduced the "Hot Topic" award. Over three and half thousand people voted for the issue they feel is most important for UK supermarkets to address. Finalists in the Independent Food Retailers category are: Abel & Cole (London), Edge & Son (Wirral), Samphire (Norfolk) and The Bath Pig Company (Somerset).

Results and winners will be announced in a celebration of all the participating companies' achievements on **Wednesday 24 October 2012** in London.
